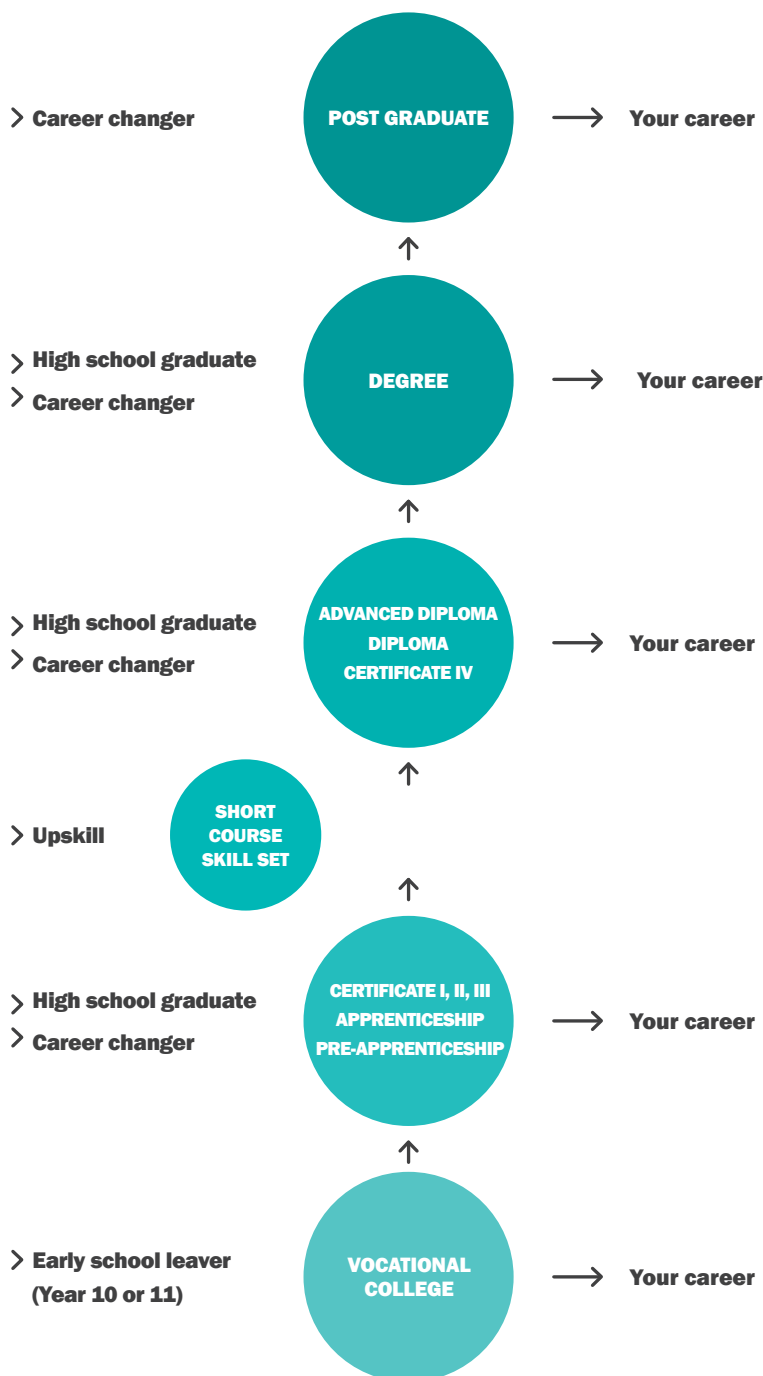

Holmesglen Campuses

BOURKE STREET

Level 3, 206 Bourke St, Melbourne

Our Bourke Street campus is suitably located in the heart of Melbourne – close to Chinatown, retail outlets and convenient public transport. The campus is a dedicated nursing training facility, which is giving Victorians greater opportunities to pursue their healthcare careers. The HLT54121 Diploma of Nursing is offered at this campus, which is perfect for those wanting to learn in the CBD.

DRUMMOND STREET

Corner Drummond and Rae Streets, Chadstone

Our Drummond Street campus is the Victorian training hub for electrical services infrastructure, civil construction, industrial skills and workplace health and safety. The campus is located just 1.5 km from our main Chadstone campus. The campus houses the Victorian Tunnelling Centre, a dedicated facility for the specialist training of workers and professionals in the construction and operation of transport and utility tunnels. The electrical services infrastructure facility trains workers to be licenced to work on Victoria's electrical distribution network.



CHADSTONE

At our Chadstone campus, you will find some of Victoria's largest and most well-known building and construction training facilities. We offer over 30 pre-apprenticeships and apprenticeships in popular areas like plumbing and carpentry – as well as niche areas like glass and glazing and stonemasonry. The Chadstone campus is also home to our international award-winning Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning Centre of Excellence. You will find a digital print centre, fashion studios, building design suites, our business faculty, IT labs, and dental technology and oral health simulation facilities. Additionally, the Holmesglen Employment Centre, connecting students and graduates with employment opportunities. Plus, our Chadstone campus has its own train station, Holmesglen, on the Glen Waverley line.

Learning Skills Centre

Keen to brush up on your academic and study skills – for free? We're here to help with assessments, report writing, research skills, note taking, summarising, referencing, time management, presentation, and general study skills.



Counselling

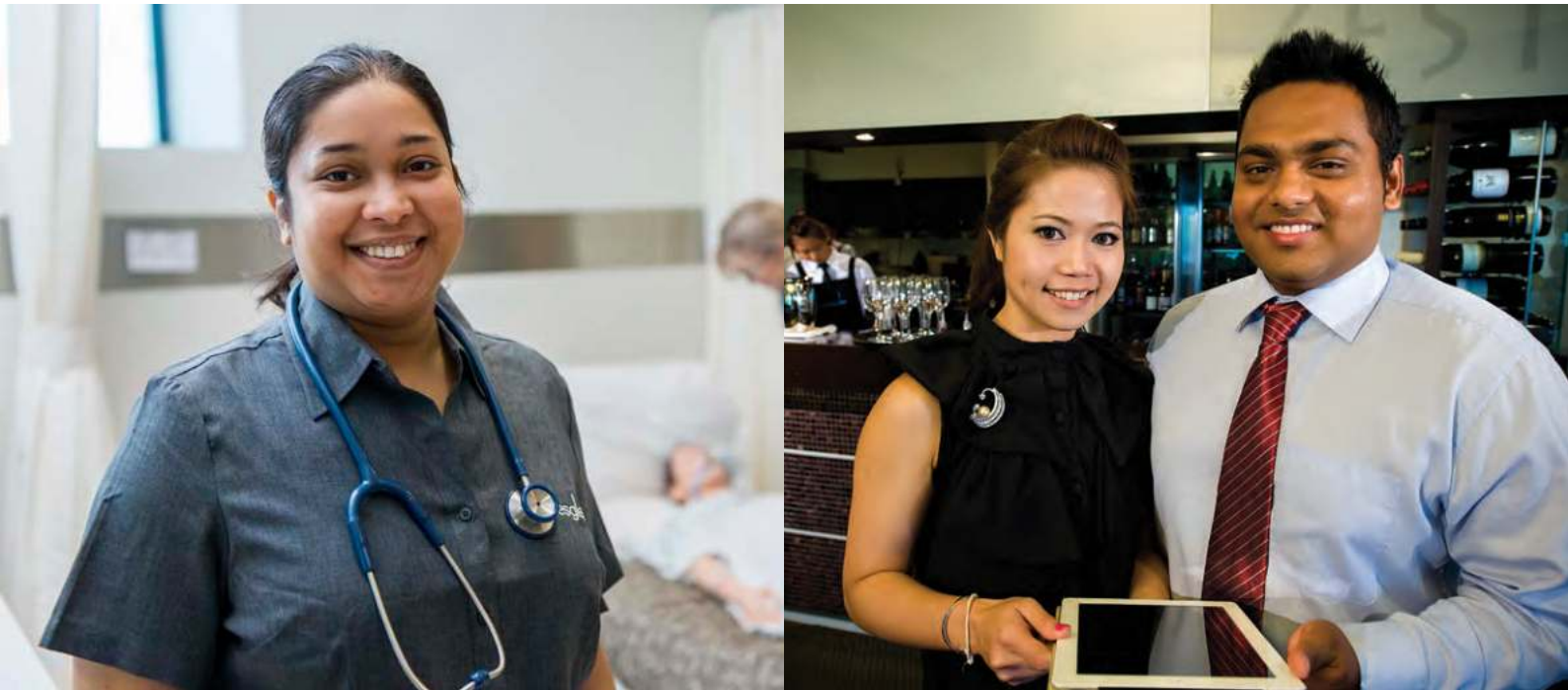

Having left school in Year 9 and being a single parent to her daughter, Lorna faced many challenges in coming back to study as a mature aged student. Course Fees

What types of fees apply to me?

Concession fees

If you're a current healthcare, pension card or veterans' gold card holder and you're applying for a certificate course, then concession fees may apply to you. Your concession eligibility will be calculated during your enrolment.

Full fees

You will be a full fee-paying student if you do not meet concession or subsidised fee criteria, or if you are an international student.

Subsidised fees

If you're an Australian or New Zealand citizen, or a holder of a permanent visa or humanitarian visa, you may be eligible for a government-subsidised place.

Everyone's personal circumstances are different - and this can affect what you pay for your training and education. If you are eligible for government-subsidised training, your tuition fees for some selected courses could be free.

How can I pay?



Upfront

Pay all your fees before starting your course.

- In person at any Holmesglen campus Information Office
- Online via the student account section on the student portal
- By cheque
- Third party invoice through the presentation of an authorisation in writing at any Holmesglen campus Information Office.
- BPAY via an invoice which will contain your BPAY details.



HECS-HELP

If you're studying a Bachelor of Nursing, you may be able to apply for a loan from the Australian government. Repayments are made through the ATO (which are deducted from your salary once you start earning over a certain amount).



Payment plan

You can organise to pay in instalments over the duration of your course.



FEE-HELP

If you're studying a degree program that does not offer HECS-HELP, you may be able to apply for a FEE-HELP loan from the Australian government. Repayments are made through the ATO (which are deducted from your salary after you start earning over a certain amount).



Scholarship

You can apply for a number of scholarships that may assist in paying your tuition fees.



VET Student Loan

If you're studying selected diplomas or advanced diplomas, you may be able to apply for a loan from the Australian government. Repayments are made through the ATO (which are deducted from your salary once you start earning over a certain amount).

You are required to pay your fees or confirm a payment method before the commencement of your first class.

MST20616 **Part time (2 years)** **February** **Chadstone**

Entry requirements: You must be enrolled as a VCE or VCE (Vocational Major) student at a Victorian secondary school.

Career opportunities: Completion of this course will provide you with a folio of fashion design work suitable for use at interview for a variety of fashion design courses, from certificate through to diploma and degree level.

Certificate II in Apparel, Fashion and Textiles

MST20722 **Full time (6 months), part time (1 year)** **February** **Chadstone**

Entry requirements: Minimum age requirement 17 years and must have completed Year 11.

Career opportunities: Designer, production assistant, machinist, quality control, wholesale, product sourcing and retail/online sales.

Certificate IV in Apparel and Fashion

MST40222 **Full time (1 year), part time (2 years)** **February** **Chadstone**

Entry requirements: Minimum age requirement 18 years and must have completed Year 11.

Career opportunities: As a graduate of this course, you may be employed in a variety of entry to mid-level roles using your specialised technical and design skills. You will have the capability to work in the fashion sector within a retail, production or design room at an entry or assistant level.
