1. PURPOSE

This Traffic Management Plan (TMP) sets out the procedures for traffic management across all campuses and assesses the risk associated with pedestrian, mobile plant and vehicle traffic across the campuses. Holmesglen aims to minimise the risks associated with vehicle and pedestrian interactions to ensure the safety of all employees, learners, consultants, contractors and visitors.

2. SCOPE

This plan applies to all employees, learners, consultants, contractors and visitors and includes delivery truck drivers and the general public on Holmesglen Institute campuses. The TMP is to be adhered to 24 hours a day, and every day of the year. Holmesglen Institute requires all persons who enter Holmesglen campuses for whatever reason to comply with this TMP.

Holmesglen campuses include the Chadstone, Glen Waverley, Moorabbin, Drummond Street, Futuretech, Bourke Street and Eildon.

4. **DEFINITIONS**

Term	Meaning
Contractors	A contractor is an individual or organisation that is formally engaged to provide works or services for or on behalf of an entity. This definition does not include casual, fixed term or temporary employees employed by the entity. A contractor may be an individual sole trader, a company, a partnership or a trust. This includes all contractors operating forklifts, mobile plant and trucks.
Consultants	A particular type of contractor that is engaged primarily to perform a discrete task for the Institute that facilitates decision making through the provision of expert advice and analysis and/or development of a written report or other intellectual output. A consultant may be an individual sole trader, a company, a partnership or a trust. Note:
	Many contractors may call themselves consultants but do not fall within this definition. The main distinguishing factor of a consultant is the predominantly advisory nature of their work.
Employees	 All persons employed at the Institute All persons operating forklifts, mobile plant and driving/walking on Holmesglen campuses.
Manager	The person who is responsible for the operations of a faculty, department, centre, unit or another functional area within Holmesglen.
