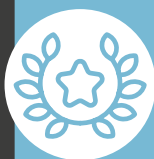

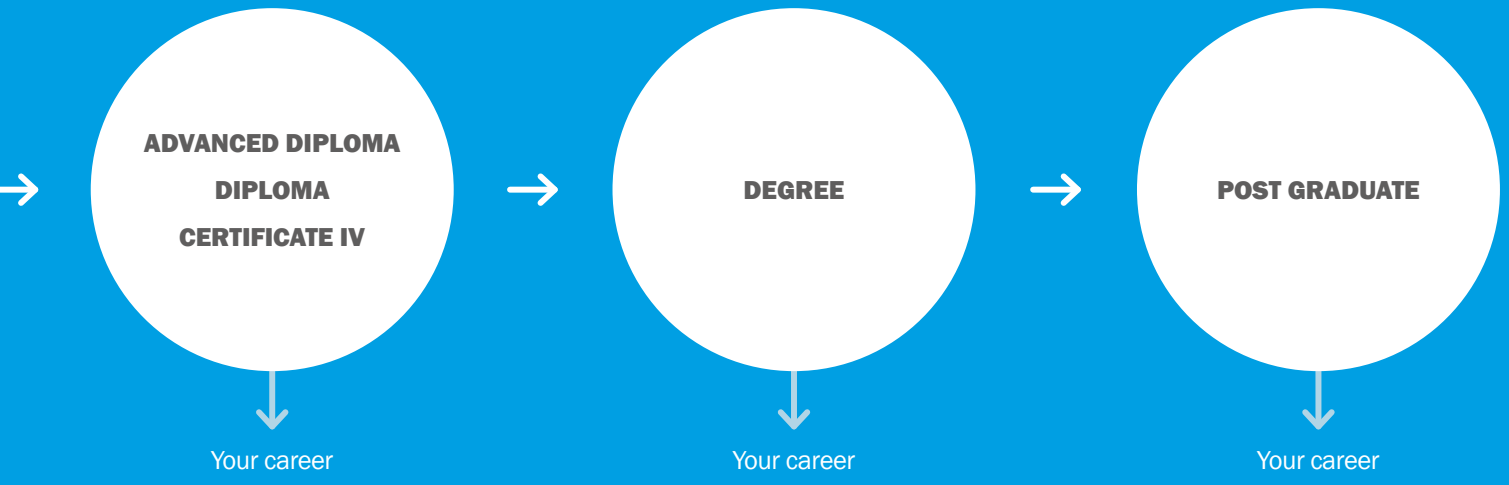

HOLMESGLEN CAMPUSES

BOURKE STREET

Level 3, 206 Bourke St, Melbourne

Our Bourke Street campus is suitably located in the heart of Melbourne – close to Chinatown, retail outlets and convenient public transport. The campus is a dedicated nursing training facility, which is giving Victorians greater opportunities to pursue their healthcare careers. The HLT54121 Diploma of Nursing is offered at this campus, which is perfect for those wanting to learn in the CBD.

The electrical services infrastructure facility trains workers to be licenced to work on Victoria's electrical distribution network.

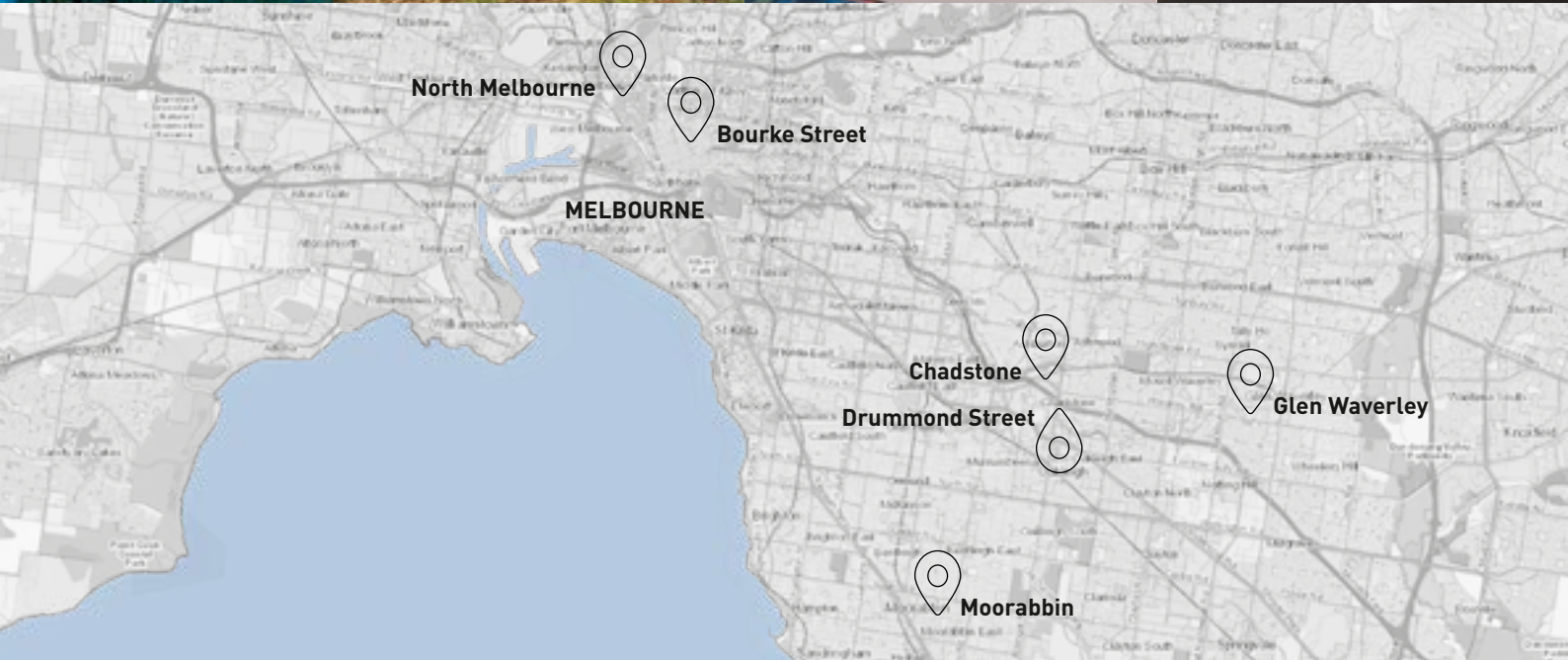

Learning Skills Centre

Keen to brush up on your academic and study skills – for free? We're here to help with assessments, report writing, research skills, note taking, summarising, referencing, time management, presentation, and general study skills.



Medical centres

SCHOLARSHIPS

WE BELIEVE IN ACCESS TO EDUCATION FOR EVERYONE. THIS IS WHY WE OFFER A RANGE OF SCHOLARSHIPS TO HELP YOU PAY FOR YOUR TUITION AND COURSE MATERIALS.



Access Scholarship

You can apply for an Access Scholarship if you are experiencing hardship that is making it difficult to study. This includes financial hardship, disability or any other form of disadvantage that may have kept you from enjoying the benefits of tertiary education. Access Scholarships are available for any certificate, diploma or advanced diploma courses and are valued up to \$2000 towards your fees, subject to the availability of funds.

Apprentice Support Fund Scholarship

The Apprentice Support Fund helps Holmesglen apprentices who, because of financial hardship, might not enjoy the full benefit of their apprenticeship. Apprentices applying for a scholarship must see a counsellor/welfare officer at Student Wellbeing or a counsellor at Apprentice Central as part of the application process. Apprentices experiencing financial hardship can apply for up to \$2000 towards fees, subject to the availability of funds.

Asylum Seeker Scholarship

You can apply for an Asylum Seeker Scholarship if you are a person seeking asylum who currently holds a Bridging Visa with the right to study, Safe Haven Enterprise Visa (SHEV) or a Temporary Protection Visa (TPV) and are enrolled or enrolling in a certificate or diploma course. Students applying for the scholarship may be eligible to receive up to \$2000 towards fees and/or course materials related to study.

International Learner Scholarship

The International Learner Scholarship is awarded to international learners who reflect Holmesglen's core values of Ambition, Scholarship, Passion, Integrity, Respect and Excellence. If you are a full fee-paying international learner, you can apply for this scholarship if you have completed at least two semesters of study at Holmesglen, have at least six months of further study and, except for the Peter Grundy Scholarship, not received another Holmesglen or government scholarship. Selection for this scholarship is based on academic transcripts, institute references, study goals and other relevant personal achievements. Scholarships are credited towards tuition fees.

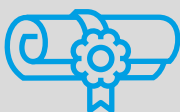
Koori Access Scholarship

If you're an Indigenous Australian or Torres Strait Islander, you can apply for a Koori Access Scholarship. This scholarship is available for any certificate, diploma or advanced diploma course.

COURSE FEES

Everyone's personal circumstances are different - and this can affect what you pay for your training and education. If you are eligible for government-subsidised training, your tuition fees for some selected courses could be free.

WHAT TYPES OF FEES APPLY TO ME?

Concession fees

If you're a current healthcare, pension card or veterans' gold card holder and you're applying for a certificate course, then concession fees may apply to you. Your concession eligibility will be calculated during your enrolment.

Full fees

You will be a full fee-paying student if you do not meet concession or subsidised fee criteria, or if you are an international student.

Subsidised fees

If you're an Australian or New Zealand citizen, or a holder of a permanent visa or humanitarian visa, you may be eligible for a government-subsidised place.

HOW CAN I PAY?



Upfront

Pay all your fees before starting your course.

- In person at any Holmesglen campus Information Office
- Online via the student account section on the student portal
- By cheque
- Third party invoice through the presentation of an authorisation in writing at any Holmesglen campus Information Office.
- BPAY via an invoice which will contain your BPAY details.



HECS-HELP

If you're studying a Bachelor of Early Childhood Teaching or Bachelor of Nursing, you may be able to apply for a loan from the Australian government. Repayments are made through the ATO (which are deducted from your salary once you start earning over a certain amount).



FEE-HELP

If you're studying a degree program that does not offer HECS-HELP, you may be able to apply for a FEE-HELP loan from the Australian government. Repayments are made through the ATO (which are deducted from your salary after you start earning over a certain amount).



Payment plan

You can organise to pay in instalments over the duration of your course.



Scholarship

You can apply for a number of scholarships that may assist in paying your tuition fees.



VET Student Loan

If you're studying selected diplomas or advanced diplomas, you may be able to apply for a loan from the Australian government. Repayments are made through the ATO (which are deducted from your salary once you start earning over a certain amount).

You are required to pay your fees or confirm a payment method before the commencement of your first class.
